
Purpose

The 1997 Base Reuse Plan's Environmental Impact Report determined: 2,400 AFY are to be provided to mitigate for the BRP impacts

The Water Augmentation Program's purpose is to facilitate 2,400 AFY of water augmentation to the Ord Community through a portfolio of projects.

Additional Background FRA Multi-Agency Agreements

7 years of Negotiation: 2008-2015

MPWMD + MRWPCA + MCWD have been negotiating source, supply and use of facilities for various projects, including Pure Water Monterey

Negotiations are almost concluded, the projects are ready for recommendations and actions.



There are 2 Water Augmentation Projects that work hand in hand with the Agencies negotiated Projects







THE PRIMARY ISSUE: HOW MUCH COST GETS PASSED ON TO THE RATE PAYER?








FORA NEEDS A PIPELINE To convey recycled water to the Ord Community


- There is no 'Pipeline' without CPUC approval of Pure Water Monterey
- MRWPCA needs a recommendation to CPUC to help enable the 'Pipeline' Project
- Commit CIP \$ to provide for new 'Pipeline' facilities alongside MCWD and MRWPCA

FORA Staff recommends a resolution to support the Pure Water Monterey Project to the California Public Utilities Commission

Why should the BOARD Recommend MRWPCA's Pure Water Project to the Public Utility Commission?

- MRWPCA is ready now, and has the necessary backing and agreements in place.
- MRWPCA can delivering at a lower cost to the rate payer than Desal, with FORA commitment
- 3. MRWPCA is able to deliver the recycled component of the Base Reuse Plan's mitigation obligation.



What does recommending MRWPCA Mean?

- FORA accepts Pure Water Monterey's Project as a mitigation solution
- FORA is committed to assigning it's mitigation dollars towards the project through Pipeline Financing Commitments



What Happens if Pure Water Monterey is Approved by the CPUC?

FORA CIP budget for Water Augmentation has set aside funds.

FORA BOARD to consider a portion of those funds to provide for the design and construction of New Facilities

WWOC will oversee the planning and provision for New Facilities per the 1998 Facilities Agreement



What about the remaining obligation?

1. It will take 20+ years to for the all the mitigations to be fully realized.

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Regional Water Augmentation Program (RUWAP)

Simple three party Scope:

- 1. Fund a Study
- 2. Establish a Technical Advisory Group
- 3. Establish a Consultant Selection committee
- 4. Enables FORA BOARD to select Secondary Project

FORA+MRWPCA+ MCWD to Study & Identify Project

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FORA Board Selection

RUWAP CEQA Re-Evaluation



The Outcome of the Study:

- 1. FORA Board selects water augmentation alternatives
- 2. FORA Board selects preferred water augmentation mix
- Purveyors define projects based on FORA selection
- 4. Path forward for all parties is identified

Additional Information



Pure Water Monterey

Provides Advanced Treated Water for various programs in the Monterey Area.

It is distinct from the RUWAP Recycled Project

However, It can share new facilities with the RUWAP Recycled Project in the form of a 'Pipeline' (Product Conveyance Facilities).

Further, MRWPCA will supply MCWD with some Recycled Water

Details



Pure Water Monterey

Takes Water that would be lost to evaporation or washed out to the Ocean from:

- Ag company washing stations
- Ag land drainage ditches
- Ag water that would go into the Salinas River
- Urban Storm-water runoff

And Subjects it to a 4 Step Treatment:

- Ozone destroys Pesticides and Pharmaceuticals (O₃ liquid Oxygen)
- Filtration removes Virus and Bacteria
- Reverse Osmosis removes heavy metals, salts, and pesticides
- Ultra-Violet treatment disinfects the water
