HCP Background



Habitat Management Plan (HMP)

- Agreement between Army & USFWS to allow transfer of property
- Established Fort Ord Habitat Reserve System
- Authorized "take" of federally listed species for cleanup
- Signatories agreed to fulfill habitat management of reserves & borderlands

Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP)

- Authorizes "take" of federal and state listed species to non-federal landowners
- Funding to manage habitat reserve system, meeting jurisdictions' HMP responsibilities
- Incidental take permit streamlines compatible growth and development
- New Joint Powers Authority (JPA) to manage and ensure HCP compliance

Public Draft Fort Ord HCP














- Covers 8 special-status plant & animal communities
- Basis for Federal & State
 Incidental Take Permit
 Issuance by USFWS and CDFW
- Provides coverage for all base reuse activities within Plan Area
 - Designated Development Areas
 - Borderlands
 - Habitat Management Areas (HMAs)


Plan Area

Why HCP?



Provides take permits for local control of Endangered Species Act (State & Federal) compliance

- Provides Certainty & Assurances
 - Mitigation & funding established for 50 years
 - Take coverage for development & HMP activity
- Community
 - Streamlined, reliable, longterm permit process

- Environment
- Coordinated ecosystem management
- Adaptive management
- Flexibility
 - Amendment process
 - Management activities & funding

Joint Powers Authority (JPA)



Purpose

- Ensure HCP permit compliance
- Secure, manage & expend funds to implement HCP
- Oversee, monitor and report on HCP implementation
- Manage Habitat Reserve System
- HCP public information & outreach
- Enforcement & implementation powers

Governing Board structure

- 14 voting members (local and State entities) and 1 non-voting member (BLM)
- Seaside, Marina and County each have 2 voting members

Key functions:

- Implementation & management of HCP
- Shared responsibilities and benefits

HCP Cooperative:

- Oversight, management, monitoring & reporting
- Single POC for Federal & State agencies
- Ensure HCP compliance

- Nov 2019: Public Meeting
- Jan 2020: Final Agreement Drafted
- Jan-Feb 2020: Outreach to Permittees
- Feb 2020: Permittee Actions on JPA Agreement
- Mar-April 2020: Begin Early Implementation Processes
- May 2020: JPA Assumes HCP Implementation
