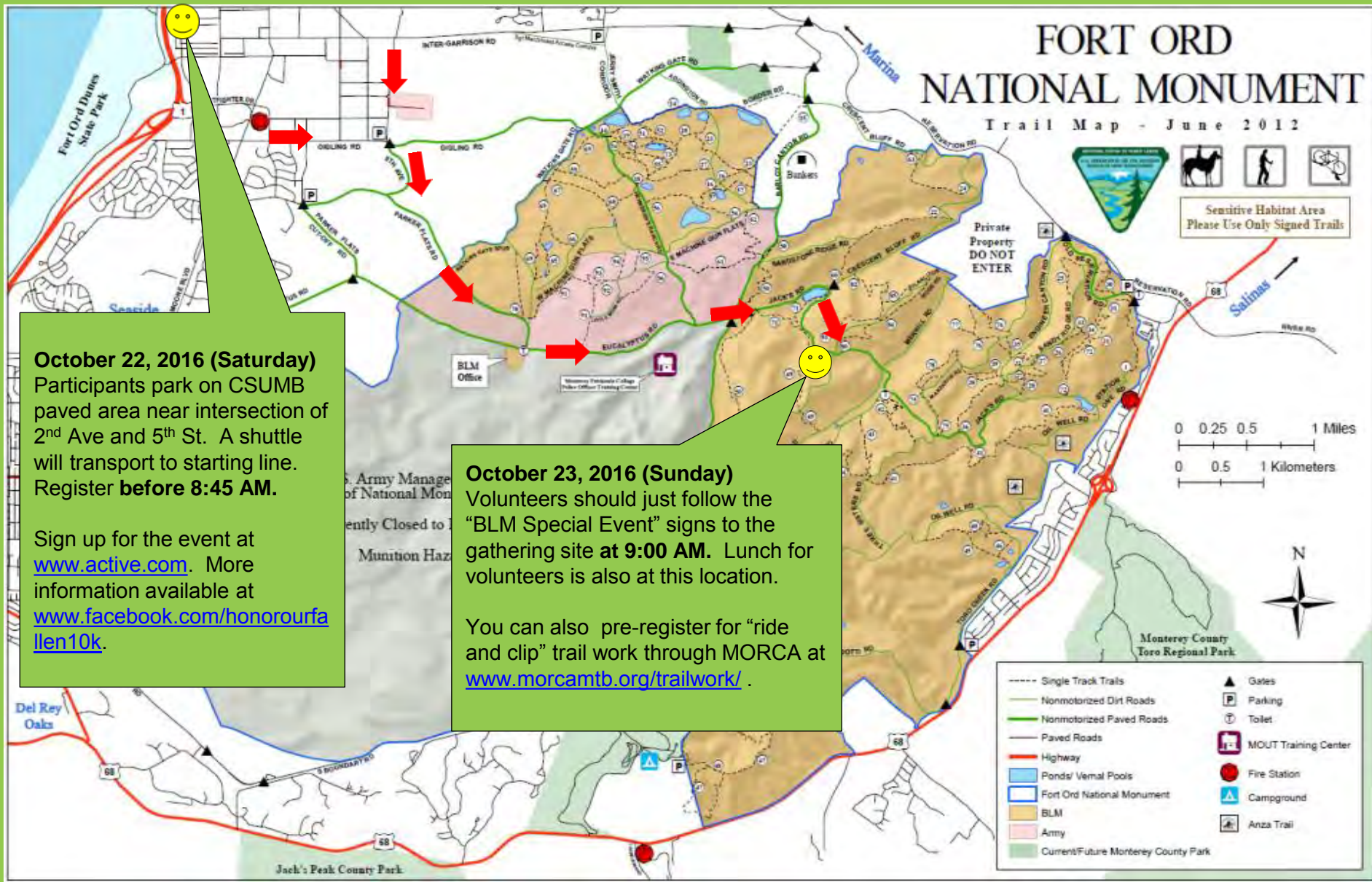

HAZARDOUS WASTE: Fort Ord, California

Who's at the top of the EPA's Superfund super villains list? Sadly, choosing a favorite is hard. While New Jersey has the most Superfund sites, California comes in second, with 98, says GoodGuide.com's **Scorecard**. But it's California **national monument Fort Ord** on Monterey Bay that covers the biggest geographical area, at 28,800 acres, according to Peter deFur, president of **Environmental Stewardship Concepts**. Closed in 1994, it was a military site used for training with highly explosive munitions. Portions of it, however, are now open as public spaces.

In 1995, Congress failed to reauthorize the industry fees that fed the Superfund program, so it ran out of money by 2003, requiring that taxpayers pick up the cost. That's right: A bunch of corporate and military polluters have taken a dump in **your backyard** -- and they left you the privilege of paying for it. But good luck with that lawsuit.
