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The purpose of this Modification is to amend the Environmental Services Agreement (ESCA) to add additional requirements and add funding in the amount of \$343,455. CLINs No. 0001A, 0001B & 0003A are being added as "variable price" line items to address the work required for Items Related to Achieve Site Closure, Items Not-Related to Achieve Site Closure and Items Related to Achieve Site Closure and Items Not-Related to Achieve Site Closure Administrative Cost starting March 31, 2019 for ESCA efforts requiring incremental resource commitments. Payments to FORA will be verified and the Army's representative will confirm the validity of the monthly Progress Report in 15 working days or less. No response from the Army within the designated time frame will constitute confirmation of validity. As a result of this modification, the maximum funding obligation has been increased by \$343,455 from \$106,162,391 to \$106,505,846.

- A. **Revise Section B, Paragraph 2.1. as follows:** The federally funded term of this ESCA shall begin upon the effective date until 30 June 2028 (or as identified in Table 1 below).
- B. **Revise Section B, Paragraph 5.1.** as follows: The maximum funding obligation of the Government to the recipient for the terms of this agreement is \$106,505,846.
