- 2. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS, ANNOUNCEMENTS AND CORRESPONDENCE: FORA Associate Planner Darren McBain acknowledged Scott Waltz's distribution of a letter to the Committee regarding agenda item 5.a.i.
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Scott Waltz urged Committee members to think strategically about the development of the former Fort Ord during the Category IV discussion.
- 4. APPROVAL OF APRIL 5, 2013 MEETING MINUTES: The Committee requested inclusion of more specificity regarding the Cat. I items previously identified to be carried over to a subsequent Cat. IV policy discussion, and then unanimously approved the draft meeting minutes

5. OLD BUSINESS

- a. Base Reuse Plan Post-Reassessment Follow-Up
 - i. Reassessment Report "Category I" topics and options

The Committee continued the April 5 discussion of the 2012 Reassessment Report's recommended "Category I" corrections to the Base Reuse Plan's (BRP) text and figures. CONCUR, Inc. meeting facilitator Scott McCreary guided the discussion. The Committee reviewed a staff-prepared draft tracked-changes summary of the Committee's April 5 review and discussion of the text edits. After requesting minor revisions to be incorporated into the final version for future Board consideration, the Committee unanimously endorsed the summary document.

The Committee completed its previous review of the Reassessment Report's comments on the individual BRP figures, and discussed a multi-step approach for addressing the report's recommended edits and other next steps regarding preparation of future map/figure exhibits. Dr. Waltz discussed his April 16, 2013 letter requesting that the Committee include preparation of a revised Figure 4.4-1, showing a level of detail consistent with the original source document, in the Committee's final recommendation. The Committee reached consensus on preferred corrections to each individual figure. Mr. McBain stated staff would

prepare a summary of the Committee's review of the BRP figures and would circulate the summary to Committee members for feedback.

ii. Reassessment Report "Category IV" topics and options

Staff distributed copies of materials that were discussed at the April 5 meeting as having potential to inform prioritization of post-reassessment policy action items. The materials included the 2011-2012 FORA Annual Report, six figures from the 2012 Reassessment Report showing base reuse implementation status, and a partial summary checklist of public input from the reassessment process. Committee Member Tom Moore, PhD, distributed a memorandum and attachment outlining his recommendation that FORA should develop measures of effectiveness (MOEs) for future reporting and monitoring purposes. Committee members and FORA Executive Officer Michael Houlemard discussed the background and structure of FORA's Annual Reports. Mr. McBain summarized several broad topic areas that received voluminous public input during the reassessment process. Michael Groves, of EMC Planning Group, stated that the public comment summary checklists intentionally excluded numerical tallies of the number of comments submitted on each subject area, with the intention of producing a policy-neutral report. The Committee took no formal actions.

BACKGROUND

At its second meeting on April 19, 2013, the PRAC continued its April 5 discussion of Category I text and figure corrections. The Committee reviewed a staff-prepared, tracked-changes draft summary of the April 5 review/discussion of text edits. After requesting minor revisions to be incorporated into the final version for future Board consideration, the Committee unanimously voted to endorse the summary document¹.

The Committee completed its previous review of the Reassessment Report's comments on the 40 individual BRP figures and developed a systematic approach for sorting and addressing future map/figure corrections. Through a collaborative deliberation process, members devised and unanimously agreed on an approach and its specific applicability to each figure. The Committee also continued initial discussion of potential Category IV prioritization considerations and factors.

Subsequently, staff prepared a summary (Attachment B) of the Committee's review of the BRP figures, and circulated it on April 26 to Committee members for confirmation prior to Board consideration. As of this writing, staff has not received corrections or suggested revisions from Committee members. Please refer to the draft April 19 meeting minutes, attached to the current, May 10 Committee packet, for a summary of the previous meeting's discussion and outcomes.

DISCUSSION

<u>"Category I" items</u>- Summary documents of the PRAC's recommendations related to the Reassessment Report's Category I actions are agendized for Board consideration (May 10, 2:00 PM) as item 7b. Concerning Recommendation i, above, staff recommends that the Committee take the following actions:

- a) Endorse the inclusion of an additional edit (see **Attachment A** and footnote 1, below), based on comments received from Administrative Committee member Carl Holm on May 1, into the PRAC's Category I text-edit recommendations; and
- b) Affirm the previously circulated, staff-prepared draft summary of the PRAC's April 19 discussion regarding Category I corrections and updates to the BRP's maps/figures (Attachment B).

<u>"Category IV" items</u>- This section of the Reassessment Report's topics/options pertains to creation of new, modified, or expanded BRP policies and programs responding to issues identified during the 2012 BRP reassessment process. A summary table identifying each Category IV subtopic is provided for reference (Attachment C). A primary charge of the PRAC is to explore the range of topics and form Category IV priority recommendations for Board consideration. The following subsections are presented as considerations and information sources that Committee members may wish to factor into their deliberations toward forming policy action-item priority recommendations.

¹ That document, which now includes an additional, staff-proposed "post-Committee" edit reflecting a comment expressed at the May 1 Administrative Committee, is presented as Attachment A to item 7b of the <u>May 10 FORA Board packet</u>. The proposed new edit appears on page 2 of the attachment. Please refer to Recommendation iii of the Board report for that item for additional discussion of this edit.

Issues raised in Committee discussion: In the two previous PRAC meetings, Committee members have identified policy considerations that the Committee may wish to integrate into its final set of recommendations. The subject areas discussed thus far include, but are not necessarily limited to:

- Implications of the pending open space-related ballot initiative (in the intervening time, a second initiative with competing objectives has been filed),
- Issues identified during the Category I review process as meriting additional policy-level discussion in the context of category IV. and
- Development of measures of effectiveness for improved monitoring of BRP implementation progress.

Previously compiled information/data: At and prior to the April 19 meeting, staff distributed materials (via a combination of web links and printed copies) that Committee members had previously identified as resources that may help inform the process of forming priority recommendations. The distributed resources included:

- Summaries of public input, by subject area, from the 2012 Reassessment process,
- FORA annual reports (2000 onward), and
- Maps/graphics illustrating Fort Ord reuse progress to date, from the Reassessment Report.

Reassessment process public input: At the April 19 meeting, staff discussed that, while the summary tables of public input from the reassessment process are of a qualitative nature, the following were some of the subject areas that received the most public input during the reassessment. The Reassessment Report topics/options references (see Attachment C summary table) most closely related to each of these subject areas follow, in parentheses. Please note that the Reassessment Report includes additional background discussion, some potential policy options, and considerations related to each of the numerical references.

- Prioritization of development within Army urbanized areas ("build on the blighted areas first") (IV-9, 17)
- Effects of the National Monument designation, recreational tourism as a potential economic catalyst, and preservation/enhancement of open space access (IV-14, IV-30 through IV-34)
- Issues related to job creation and economic development (IV-4, 12-16)

The preceding subsections are intended as an overview of previous Committee discussion of potential Category IV prioritization considerations, for continuation at the May 10 meeting. However, at the meeting, Committee members may wish to suggest additional or alternative approaches.

Procedural note: Scott McCreary, PhD, of CONCUR Inc. has provided professional facilitation services for the PRAC's meetings to date. The CONCUR contract amendment provides budget authority for three committee meetings. The May 10 PRAC meeting will be meeting #3. Facilitation services for any additional PRAC meetings, if desired, will require either additional budget authority or a possible internal contract budget reallocation reducing the number of hours currently allocated to tasks other than the actual meetings. CONCUR is still scoped to facilitate a/hird Board workshop (date to be determined).

Program E-2.3: The City of Marina shall preserve sufficient land at the former Fort Ord for right-of-ways to serve long-range commercial build-outs.

Volume II, Page 265

Program B-2.4: In the Planned Development/Mixed Use District in the Existing City of Marina Neighborhoods Planning Area, intended for public facilities such as the future Marina Civic Center and related facilities, the City shall install an open space barrier along the border of adjacent Polygons 5a and 5b to prevent potential degradation of this undeveloped habitat. Both polygons provide corridor linkage from the maritime chaparral around the airfield to the habitats in the interior.

Program C-1.3: The City of Marina shall designate land uses for the following park locations and acreages:

- Neighborhood Park in housing area (Polygon 4): 27 acres.
- Neighborhood Park with community recreation center (Polygon 2B): 10 acres.
- Community Park at existing equestrian center (Polygon 2G): 39.5 acres.
- Community Park with equestrian trailhead (Polygon 17A): 46 acres.

Note: Polygon 17A is near the Youth Camp and is not within the City of Marina.

Program C-1.2: The County of Monterey shall designate land uses for the following park locations and acreages:

- Neighborhood Park in Eucalyptus Road Residential Planning Area (Polygon 19a):
 10 acres

- Community Park with equestrian trailhead (Polygon 17A): 46 acres.
