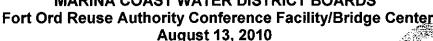

## **MINUTES** of the **JOINT MEETING OF THE**

### 1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL OF BOTH BOARDS

With a quorum present FORA Chair/Mayor Rubio called the August 2010 Joint Board of meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. and requested a roll call of both Boards.

### 6. NEW BUSINESS

Item 6a - Ord Community and Marina Water/Wastewater Systems Proposed Budgets and Rates for FY 2010-2011:

Item 6a (1) - Presentation by Marina Coast Water District: Chair Mayor Rubio introduced FORA Executive Officer Michael Houlemard who announced that Marina Coast Water District ("MCWD") would give a presentation on the proposed budget and rates for FY 2010 2011. Mr. Houlemard then introduced MCWD Finance Director Suresh Prasad. The Boards of both MCWD and FORA received a PowerPoint presentation and corresponding handouts requesting consideration of community rates, fees, and charges pertaining to the Community Water/Wastewater systems for the FY 2010/2011. Mr. Prasad noted that the Resolutions requesting both Boards approval were attached to the Board agenda. He further noted that the Resolutions for MCWD Nos. 2010-58 (compensation plan) and 2010-59, the capacity fee element of the budget. Mr. Prasad gave a history of the budget approval process noting that in 1998 both FORA and MCWD signed an agreement which requires annual approval of the compensation plan. In 2008, MCW Bronsultant Bartle Wells Associates completed a 5 year water and wastewater financial plan and rate study. Additionally, Mr. Prasad noted proposition 218 requires that for any operating rate increase on the Ord Community service area that resident's be notified. He stated that on May 21, 2010 residents were notified and a second notice mailed to district customers on June 25, 2010. Mr. Prasad noted that the budger assumptions included a customer water bill increase equal to 7.8% - \$3.61 and sewer bill increase of 7.8% - \$1.76 on average. There are surcharges that remain unchanged \$20.00 for water and \$5.00 for wastewater. He said that there were 1201 accounts that were un-metered and these were owned by the Army. Mr. Prasad presented a Water and Wastewater survey of surrounding jurisdictions and capacity charges (per EDU) which were fairly competitive on the water side. The sewer rates are higher because there are not enough customers to support the large extensive system. In summary the rate increases are needed to maintain district operations and debt coverage requirements. He also noted that out of 2814 Ord Community customers only 7 protests had been received further stating that fifty percent plus one is necessary for a protest.

Jim Heitzman, General Manager for MCWD asked if anyone had questions about metered accounts or unmetered accounts. Brian True, Capital Projects Manager for MCWD clarified that the Army has roughly 1200 unmetered accounts, however all the new construction will have meters installed. Progress is being made on having meters installed in the Army housing and working diligently toward having zero unmetered water accounts. Mr. True further stated that close to \$30M of improvements have been made on the former Fort Ord.

Chair Rubio asked if there were any questions from the Board members present. Councilmember Mancini stated that he had concerns about the rate increases since 1998. Colonel Brewer stated that \$36,000 per month is being paid out of the Army's housing projects. Mr. True stated that there were nominal costs associated with installation of meters. Colonel Brewer also stated that he would prefer the housing to be "smart-metered" in order to have the ability to run reports. The discussion included questions regarding higher rates for Preston Park vs. central Marina to which Mr. Prasad answered that Preston Park is former Fort Ord property, while central Marina is "old" Marina. Former Fort Ord has 23 lift

stations and not enough customers yet to support the infrastructure, while Marina has only 6 or 7 lift stations supporting it. The entire system still needs to be maintained even though there are not enough customers to support it.

Item 6a (2) - <u>PUBLIC HEARING - Proposition 218 Notice</u>: MCWD President Kenneth Nishi opened the public hearing. MCWD counsel Anne Secker reminded all that written protests could still be submitted. Jan Shriner a resident of Marina commented on the struggling community and the economic crisis young families are facing including the rate hikes proposed by MCWD. No further comments from the public were made.

Item 6a (3) - FORA Board Approval of Resolution Nos. 10-10 and 10-11 Adopting a Compensation Plan and Setting Rates, Fees and Charges for Base-Wide Water, Recycled Water and Sewer. Chair Rubio called for the question to entertain a FORA Board motion. Motion to approve was made by 1st Vice Chair/Supervisor Potter, seconded by Mayor McCloud, and carried unanimously.

Item 6a (4) - Services on the Former Fort Ord MCWD Board Consider Adoption of Resolution Nos. 2010-58 and 2010-59 (Ord Community Budget and Compensation Plan): President Kenneth Nishi requested MCWD Board approval. Motion to approve was made by Howard Gufstason, seconded by Dan Burns, and carried unanimously.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

- 2. Conduct a public hearing on the proposed changes in monthly rates, fees and charges for MCWD service areas (Attachment B), and
- 3. Fort Ord Reuse Authority ("FORA") Board of Directors approve Resolutions #10-10 and #10-11 (Attachment C) adopting a compensation plan and setting rates, fees and charges for basewide water, recycled water and sewer services on the former Fort Ord, and
- 4. <u>MCWD Board of Directors</u> adopt Resolutions #2010-58 and #2010-59 (Ord Community Budget and Compensation Plan (**Attachment D**).

## **BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:**

Following the May 1997 Fort Ord Reuse Authority ("FORA") Board selection of MCWD to operate and own both the former Fort Ord water and wastewater collection systems, MCWD began service in July 1997. Between July 1997 and October 2001, MCWD operated the systems under Cooperative Agreement with the U.S. Army that defined terms of their operations and funding. Since November 2001, MCWD has owned the systems following the Economic Development Conveyance (U.S. Army to FORA to MCWD) of the related real and personal property associated with the network. MCWD bills former Fort Ord customers according to FORA Board annually approved rates.

The Water and Wastewater Oversight Committee ("WWOC"), advisory to FORA on budgets and rates, met in March and April 2010 to receive presentations and to review/ recommend action on MCWD's proposed FY 2010/11budgets and rates. On April 14, 2010 the WWOC unanimously recommended FORA Board approve the attached budgets and rates.

FORA staff and the WWOC recommend that the FORA Board receive the MCWD staff presentation and approve the adopting Resolutions. These Resolutions are provided to Board members in preparation for the MCWD presentation and requested Board action. To conserve resources, one copy of the budgets and rates package is provided - please note it is referenced /appended to both resolutions.

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## Draft FY 2010-2011 Ord Community Service Area Budget Summary

<u>Introduction.</u> The purpose of this summary is to provide an overview of the FY 2010-2011 Budget document and the key assumptions used in developing this Budget document.

In, accordance with Article 7 of the Water Wastewater Facilities Agreement between Marina Coast Water District (MCWD) and Fort Ord Reuse Authority (FORA), the District maintains separate cost centers to ensure that revenues and expenses are appropriately segregated and maintained for the Marina systems, the Ord Community systems, and the accruing costs for the Regional Water Augmentation Project. On October 25, 2006, the MCWD Board adopted Ordinance No. 43 which also requires the cost centers to remain separated after the expiration of the Agreement between MCWD and FORA.

District costs that are not dedicated to a specific cost center are shared among the four primary cost centers — Marina Water, Marina Wastewater Collection, Ord Community Water and Ord Community Wastewater Collection. General overhead costs are also allocated in this manner which, in turn, creates efficiencies and cost savings for administrative functions for the two service areas that would otherwise not be realized. The District uses the operating expenses ratio to allocate the shared expenses. The allocation rate for the proposed fiscal year has changed based on previous year (FY 2008-2009) audited expenditure figures.

The FORA Board adopts the Ord Community budgets by resolution before MCWD Board adopts the entire budget, also by resolution.

A five-year financial plan and rate study was completed in 2008 and recommendations from the rate study are incorporated in this budget document.

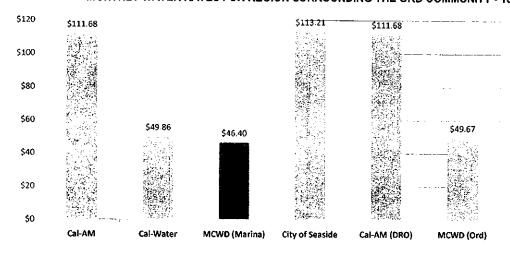

- (1) The 1996/1998 FORA Board Allocation Plan reflects 1410 afy that considers future conservation on the POM Annex. The OMC's current reservation of 1577 afy reflects the decrease of 38 afy and 114 afy (see footnote [4]) from the original 1729 afy. The FORA Board has not yet revised the allocation numbers to reflect this change.
- (3) The Sunbay/Thorson property was given its own allocation (120 afy) as part of the transfer of real estate from the US Army to the Southwest Sunbay Land Company.
- (4) Seaside's original allocation of 710 afy was augmented by 38 afy by agreement with the OMC and Brostrom, and by 114 afy under final terms of the land exchange agreement among the City of Seaside, Monterey Bay Land, LLC and the US Army.
- (5) 114 afy of Monterey Bay Land, LLC controlled potable water includes the proviso that the City of Seaside shall use no less than 39 afy of such water for affordable or workforce housing.

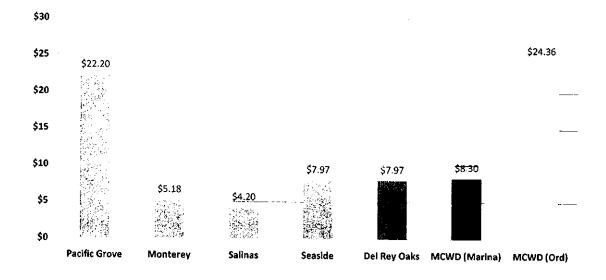

<u>Public Hearing for Marina Service Area</u>: The previously scheduled meeting has been moved from July 13 to August 10, 2010, 7:00 p.m., MCWD Office, 11 Reservation Road, Marina, CA

<u>Public Hearing for Ord Community Service Area</u>: The previously scheduled meeting has been moved from July 9 to August 13, 2010, 3:00 p.m., FORA Conference Facility/Bridge Center, 201 13<sup>th</sup> St., Building 2925, Marina, CA

The Marina Coast Water District (MCWD) proposes to update the water and wastewater rates, fees and charges in order to be able to continue to operate, maintain and improve the District's water and wastewater facilities for the areas MCWD serves in Marina and on the former Fort Ord. The area the District serves on the former Ft. Ord is known as the "Ord Community Service Area." Except as changed by these updates, other existing rates, fees and charges will remain in effect. Changes to rates, fees and charges for the Ord Community Service Area require approval by both MCWD and the Fort Ord Reuse Authority (FORA).

<u>PROPOSED INCREASE FOR WATER AND WASTEWATER RATES</u>. The District currently charges customers a monthly fee for water based on the amount of the water consumed. The monthly consumption rate is currently an inclining block with three tiers. The District currently charges a flat rate for wastewater services. The District proposes to increase water and wastewater rates as set forth herein.

**PROPOSED INCREASE FOR WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICE FEES.** The District currently charges monthly service fees as a condition of service, based on the cost of labor and materials necessary to provide the services. The District proposes to increase water and wastewater service fees as set forth herein.

REASON FOR THE INCREASES. Since the last rate increase, the costs of energy, labor, raw materials and all other components necessary to provide water and wastewater services and to maintain and repair the facilities used to provide such services have increased. The proposed 7.8% for Marina and 7.8% for former Fort Ord increase is based information presented by engineering and financial advisors to the Boards of Directors of FORA and MCWD demonstrating the need to increase rates, fees and charges to maintain water and wastewater services within the MCWD's existing service areas. The specific information relating to the need for the rate increase as well as the calculation of the amount of the increase is on file at the MCWD's office.

HOW THE RATES, FEES AND CHARGES WERE CALCULATED. A study has been conducted by an independent consulting firm. That study concluded that the proposed rates will provide enough funds for the District to recover the cost of operation & maintenance and administration. All rates, fees and charges are calculated based on the cost to provide services. The water rates are calculated based on the amount of water used. Wastewater rates are calculated based on the amount of wastewater discharged, measured by equivalent dwelling units

(one residence equals one dwelling unit).

## Resolution of the Board of Directors Fort Ord Reuse Authority

Adopting the Budget and the Ord Community Compensation Plan for FY 2010-2011 not including Capacity Charges

## August 13, 2010

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors ("Directors") of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority ("FORA"), at a regular meeting duly called and held on August 13, 2010 at the business office of FORA 100 12<sup>th</sup> St., Bldg. 2880, Marina California as follows:

WHEREAS, Marina Coast Water District ("District") Staff prepared and presented the draft FY 2010-2011 Budget (Attachment A) which includes projected revenues, expenditures and capital improvement projects for the Ord Community Water, Recycled Water and Wastewater systems, including the area within the jurisdiction of FORA and the area remaining within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army; and,

WHEREAS, FORA is authorized by the FORA Act, particularly Government Code 67679(a)(1), to arrange for the provision of water and wastewater services to the Ord Community; and

WHEREAS, the District and FORA, entered into a "Water/Wastewater Facilities Agreement" ("the Agreement") on March 13, 1998, and have subsequently duly amended the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides a procedure for establishing budgets and compensation plans to provide for sufficient revenues to pay the direct and indirect, short-term and long-term costs, including capital costs, to furnish the water and wastewater facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement, as amended, provides that FORA and the District will each adopt the annual Budget and Compensation Plan by resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed Budget and Compensation Plan for 2010-2011 provides for funds necessary to meet operating and capital expenses for sound operation and provision of the water, recycled water and wastewater facilities and to enable MCWD to provide continued water, recycled water and sewer services within the existing service areas on the former Fort Ord. The rates, fees and charges adopted by FORA apply only to the area within FORA's jurisdictional boundaries; and,

WHEREAS, the Water/Wastewater Oversight Committee of FORA and the MCWD full Board have reviewed the proposed Budget and Compensation Plan; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, FORA and MCWD have adopted and implemented and acted in reliance on budgets and compensation plans for prior fiscal years; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, FORA and MCWD cooperated in the conveyance to MCWD of easements, facilities and ancillary rights for the water, recycled water and wastewater systems on the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, MCWD has provided water and wastewater services on the former Fort Ord by contract since 1997, and currently provides water and wastewater services to the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction under the authority of the Agreement, and provides such services to the portion of the former Fort Ord still under the Army's jurisdiction by contract with the Army; and,

WHEREAS, FORA and MCWD have agreed that water conservation is a high priority, and have implemented a water conservation program in the Ord Community service area that includes public education, various incentives to use low-flow fixtures, and water-conserving landscaping. The rates, fees and charges adopted by this Resolution 10-10 are intended to support the water conservation program and encourage water conservation, pursuant to sections 375 and 375.5 of the California Water Code. This conservation program and these rates, fees and charges are in the public interest, serve a public purpose, and will promote the health, welfare, and safety of Ord Community, and will enhance the economy and quality of life of the Monterey Bay community; and,

WHEREAS, estimated revenues from the rates, fees and charges will not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the services for which the rates, fees or charges are imposed, will not be used for any purpose other than that for which the fee or charge was imposed, will not exceed the proportional cost of the service attributable to each identified parcel upon which the fee or charge is proposed for imposition and no fee or charge will be imposed for a service unless that service is actually used by, or immediately available to, the owner of the property in question; and,

WHEREAS, after a public meeting based upon staff's recommendations, the Board has determined that the Budget and Compensation Plan, including the rates, fees and charges therein, should be adopted as set forth on **Attachment A** to this Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, FORA has held a joint hearing with Marina Coast Water District on the rates, fees and charges, not including Capacity Charges, for the Compensation Plan pursuant to and in accordance with Section 6 of Article XIIID of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, at the joint hearing, the Board heard and considered all protests to the Compensation Plan and the rates, fees and charges proposed and finds that written protests were submitted by less than a majority of the record owners of each identified parcel upon which the fee or charge is proposed for imposition; and,

WHEREAS, Capacity Charges for the FY 2010-2011 are the subject of and will be adopted by a separate Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, FORA is the lead agency for the adoption of rates, fees and charges for the area of the Ord Community under FORA's jurisdiction, and that in adopting rates and charges for that area, the District is acting as a responsible agency and relying on FORA's compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); that the District has previously adopted rates, fees and charges for its jurisdictional service area; and that, in approving rates, fees and charges for the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army, the District is acting to provide continued water, recycled water and sewer service within existing service areas on the Ord Community, and that such action is exempt from CEQA pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8) and Section 15273 of the State CEQA Guidelines codified at 14 CCR §15273.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS.

- 1. The Board of Directors of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority does hereby approve and adopt FY 2010-2011 Budget and Compensation Plan, not including Capacity Charges for water, recycled water and wastewater services to the Ord Community.
- 2. The District is authorized to charge and collect rates for provision of water and wastewater services within the boundaries of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority in accordance with the rates, fees and charges set forth in **Attachment A**, not including Capacity Charges and. The District is further authorized to use the same rates, fees and charges in providing services to the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army.
- 3. The rates, fees and charges authorized by this Resolution shall not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the services for which the rates, fees or charges are imposed.

WHEREAS, Marina Coast Water District ("District") Staff prepared and presented the draft FY 2010-2011 Budget which includes projected revenues, expenditures and capital improvement projects for the Ord Community Water, Recycled Water and Wastewater systems, including the area within the jurisdiction of FORA and the area remaining within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army; and,

WHEREAS, FORA is authorized by the FORA Act, particularly Government Code 67679(a)(1), to arrange for the provision of water and wastewater services to the Ord Community; and

WHEREAS, the District and FORA, entered into a "Water/Wastewater Facilities Agreement" ("the Agreement") on March 13, 1998, and have subsequently duly amended the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement provides a procedure for establishing budgets and compensation plans to provide for sufficient revenues to pay the direct and indirect, short-term and long-term costs, including capital costs, to furnish the water and wastewater facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement, as amended, provides that FORA and the District will each adopt the annual Budget and Compensation Plan by resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed Budget and Compensation Plan for 2010-2011 provides for funds necessary to meet operating and capital expenses for sound operation and provision of the water, recycled water and wastewater facilities and to enable the District to provide continued water, recycled water and sewer services within the existing service areas on the former Fort Ord. The rates, fees and charges adopted by FORA apply only to the area within FORA's jurisdictional boundaries; and,

WHEREAS, a financing study prepared by Citigroup Global Markets Inc. in 2005 for the District recommended the adoption of capacity charges as an element of financing capital facilities for water and wastewater services to the Ord Community; and,

WHEREAS, the Water/Wastewater Oversight Committee of FORA and the District full Board have reviewed the proposed Budget and Compensation Plan; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, FORA and the District have adopted and implemented and acted in reliance on budgets and compensation plans for prior fiscal years; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, FORA and the District have cooperated in the conveyance to the District of easements, facilities and ancillary rights for the water, recycled water and wastewater systems on the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, the District has provided water and wastewater services on the former Fort Ord by contract since 1997, and currently provides water and wastewater services to the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction under the authority of the Agreement, and provides such services to the portion of the former Fort Ord still under the Army's jurisdiction by contract with the Army; and,

WHEREAS, capacity charges are imposed as a condition of service to customers. The charges are not imposed upon real property or upon persons as an incident of real property ownership; and,

WHEREAS, estimated revenues from the capacity charges will not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the facilities and services for which the charges are imposed; and,

WHEREAS, the capacity charges and have not been calculated nor developed on the basis of any parcel map, including any assessor's parcel map; and,

WHEREAS, no written requests are on file with the District for mailed notice of meetings on new or increased fees or service charges pursuant to Government Code Section 66016. At least 10 days prior to the meeting, the District made available to the public data indicating the amount of cost, or estimated cost, required to provide the service for which the fee or service charge is levied and the revenue sources anticipated to provide the service; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the increase in capacity charges exceeds the percentage increase in the Implicit Price Deflator for State and Local Government Purchases, as determined by the Department of Finance. As a result, the District cannot charge the increased capacity fee to any school district, county office of education, community college district, state agency, or the University of California before first negotiating the increases with those entities in accordance with District Code section 6.16.020 and Government Code section 54999.3. Although these sections also apply to California State University at Monterey Bay, the District has complied with its obligation to negotiate with it and can charge the increased amounts to CSUMB as a result of and as limited by a Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release dated June 1, 2006, by which the District and California State University made an agreement regarding the amount of all future capacity charges. Accordingly, the District can charge the increased capacity charges as limited by the Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release immediately to CSUMB. The increased capacity charges to any other school district, state agency, county office of education, community college district or the University of California will be effective only when negotiations are concluded with those entities; and,

WHEREAS, after a public meeting and based upon staff's recommendations, the Board has determined that the capital elements of the Budget and Compensation Plan, including the capacity charges therein, should be adopted as set forth on **Attachment A** to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 54999.3 requires that before imposing certain capital facilities fees on certain educational and state entities, any public agency providing public utility service must negotiate with the entities receiving the service; and

WHEREAS, FORA is the lead agency for the adoption of rates, fees and charges for the area of the Ord Community under FORA's jurisdiction, and that in adopting rates and charges for that area, the District is acting as a responsible agency and relying on FORA's compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); that the District has previously adopted rates, fees and charges for its jurisdictional service area; and that, in approving rates, fees and charges for the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army, the District is acting to provide continued water and sewer service within existing

service areas on the Ord Community, and that such action is exempt from CEQA pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8) and Section 15273 of the State CEQA Guidelines codified at 14 CCR §15273.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS,

- 1. The Board of Directors of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority does hereby approve and adopt the capital elements of the FY 2010-2011 Budget for water, recycled water and wastewater services to the Ord Community.
- 2. The capital elements of the compensation plan for the area of Ord Community within FORA's jurisdiction, including capacity charges, set forth on **Attachment A** to this Resolution are hereby approved and adopted. The District is authorized to charge and collect capacity charges for provision of water and wastewater services within the boundaries of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority in accordance with the schedule set forth in **Attachment A**. The District is further authorized to use the same charges in providing services to the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army.
- 3. The charges authorized by this Resolution shall not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the services for which the charges are imposed.
- 4. The District will comply with the requirements of Government Code section 54999.3 before imposing a capital facilities fee (as defined in Government Code section 54999.1) on any school district, county office of education, community college district, the California State University, the University of California or state agency.

WHEREAS, MCWD has provided water and wastewater services on the former Fort Ord by contract since 1997, and currently provides water and wastewater services to the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction under the authority of the Agreement, and provides such services to the portion of the former Fort Ord still under the Army's jurisdiction by contract with the Army; and,

WHEREAS, FORA and MCWD have agreed that water conservation is a high priority, and have implemented a water conservation program in the Ord Community service area that includes public education, various incentives to use low-flow fixtures, and water-conserving landscaping. The rates, fees and charges adopted by this Resolution 10-09 are intended to support the water conservation program and encourage water conservation, pursuant to sections 375 and 375.5 of the California Water Code. This conservation program and these rates, fees and charges are in the public interest, serve a public purpose, and will promote the health, welfare, and safety of Ord Community, and will enhance the economy and quality of life of the Monterey Bay community; and,

WHEREAS, estimated revenues from the rates, fees and charges will not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the services for which the rates, fees or charges are imposed, will not be used for any purpose other than that for which the fee or charge was imposed, will not exceed the proportional cost of the service attributable to each identified parcel upon which the fee or charge is proposed for imposition and no fee or charge will be imposed for a service unless that service is actually used by, or immediately available to, the owner of the property in question; and,

WHEREAS, after a public meeting based upon staff's recommendations, the Board has determined that the Budget and Compensation Plan, including the rates, fees and charges therein, should be adopted as set forth on **Attachment A** to this Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, FORA has held a joint hearing with Marina Coast Water District on the rates, fees and charges, not including Capacity Charges, for the Compensation Plan pursuant to and in accordance with Section 6 of Article XIIID of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, at the joint hearing, the Board heard and considered all protests to the Compensation Plan and the rates, fees and charges proposed and finds that written protests were submitted by less than a majority of the record owners of each identified parcel upon which the fee or charge is proposed for imposition; and,

WHEREAS, Capacity Charges for the FY 2010-2011 are the subject of and will be adopted by a separate Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, FORA is the lead agency for the adoption of rates, fees and charges for the area of the Ord Community under FORA's jurisdiction, and that in adopting rates and charges for that area, the District is acting as a responsible agency and relying on FORA's compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); that the District has previously adopted rates, fees and charges for its jurisdictional service area; and that, in approving rates, fees and charges for the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army, the District is acting to provide continued water, recycled water and sewer service within existing service areas on the Ord Community, and that such action is exempt from CEQA

pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8) and Section 15273 of the State CEQA Guidelines codified at 14 CCR §15273.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS,

- 1. The Board of Directors of the Marina Coast Water District does hereby approve and adopt FY 2010-2011 Budget and Compensation Plan, not including Capacity Charges for water, recycled water and wastewater services to the Ord Community.
- 2. The District is authorized to charge and collect rates for provision of water and wastewater services within the boundaries of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority in accordance with the rates, fees and charges set forth in **Attachment A**, not including Capacity Charges and. The District is further authorized to use the same rates, fees and charges in providing services to the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army.
- 3. The rates, fees and charges authorized by this Resolution shall not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the services for which the rates, fees or charges are imposed.

#### Resolution No. 2010 - 59 Resolution of the Board of Directors Marina Coast Water District

Adopting the Capacity Charge element of the Budget and the Ord Community Compensation Plan for FY 2010-2011

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors ("Directors") of the Marina Coast Water District ("District"), at a special meeting duly called and held on August 13, 2010 at the business office of Fort Ord Reuse Authority ("FORA") 100 12<sup>th</sup> St., Bldg. 2880, Marina California as follows:

WHEREAS, the District Staff prepared and presented the draft FY 2010-2011 Budget which includes projected revenues, expenditures and capital improvement projects for the Ord Community Water, Recycled Water and Wastewater systems, including the area within the jurisdiction of FORA and the area remaining within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army; and,

WHEREAS, FORA is authorized by the FORA Act, particularly Government Code 67679(a)(1), to arrange for the provision of water and wastewater services to the Ord Community; and

WHEREAS, the District and FORA, entered into a "Water/Wastewater Facilities Agreement" ("the Agreement") on March 13, 1998, and have subsequently duly amended the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement provides a procedure for establishing budgets and compensation plans to provide for sufficient revenues to pay the direct and indirect, short-term and long-term costs, including capital costs, to furnish the water and wastewater facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement, as amended, provides that FORA and the District will each adopt the annual Budget and Compensation Plan by resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed Budget and Compensation Plan for 2010-2011 provides for funds necessary to meet operating and capital expenses for sound operation and provision of the water, recycled water and wastewater facilities and to enable the District to provide continued water, recycled water and sewer services within the existing service areas on the former Fort Ord. The rates, fees and charges adopted by FORA apply only to the area within FORA's jurisdictional boundaries; and,

WHEREAS, a financing study prepared by Citigroup Global Markets Inc. in 2005 for the District recommended the adoption of capacity charges as an element of financing capital facilities for water and wastewater services to the Ord Community; and,

WHEREAS, the Water/Wastewater Oversight Committee of FORA and the District full Board have reviewed the proposed Budget and Compensation Plan; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, FORA and the District have adopted and implemented and acted in reliance on budgets and compensation plans for prior fiscal years; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, FORA and the District have cooperated in the conveyance to the District of easements, facilities and ancillary rights for the water, recycled water and wastewater systems on the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, the District has provided water and wastewater services on the former Fort Ord by contract since 1997, and currently provides water and wastewater services to the area of the former Fort Ord within FORA's jurisdiction under the authority of the Agreement, and provides such services to the portion of the former Fort Ord still under the Army's jurisdiction by contract with the Army; and,

WHEREAS, capacity charges are imposed as a condition of service to customers. The charges are not imposed upon real property or upon persons as an incident of real property ownership; and,

WHEREAS, estimated revenues from the capacity charges will not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the facilities and services for which the charges are imposed; and,

WHEREAS, the capacity charges have not been calculated nor developed on the basis of any parcel map, including any assessor's parcel map; and,

WHEREAS, no written requests are on file with the District for mailed notice of meetings on new or increased fees or service charges pursuant to Government Code Section 66016. At least 10 days prior to the meeting, the District made available to the public data indicating the amount of cost, or estimated cost, required to provide the service for which the fee or service charge is levied and the revenue sources anticipated to provide the service; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the increase in capacity charges exceeds the percentage increase in the Implicit Price Deflator for State and Local Government Purchases, as determined by the Department of Finance. As a result, the District cannot charge the increased capacity fee to any school district, county office of education, community college district, state agency, or the University of California before first negotiating the increases with those entities in accordance with District Code section 6.16.020 and Government Code section 54999.3. Although these sections also apply to California State University at Monterey Bay, the District has complied with its obligation to negotiate with it and can charge the increased amounts to CSUMB as a result of and as limited by a Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release dated June 1, 2006, by which the District and California State University made an agreement regarding the amount of all future capacity charges. Accordingly, the District can charge the increased capacity charges as limited by the Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release immediately to CSUMB. The increased capacity charges to any other school district, state agency, county office of education, community college district or the University of California will be effective only when negotiations are concluded with those entities; and,

WHEREAS, after a public meeting and based upon staff's recommendations, the Board has determined that the capital elements of the Budget and Compensation Plan, including the capacity charges therein, should be adopted as set forth on **Attachment A** to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 54999.3 requires that before imposing certain capital facilities fees on certain educational and state entities, any public agency providing public utility service must negotiate with the entities receiving the service; and

WHEREAS, FORA is the lead agency for the adoption of rates, fees and charges for the area of the Ord Community under FORA's jurisdiction, and that in adopting rates and charges for that area, the District is acting as a responsible agency and relying on FORA's compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); that the District has previously adopted rates, fees and charges for its jurisdictional service area; and that, in approving rates, fees and charges for the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army, the District is acting to provide continued water and sewer service within existing service areas on the Ord Community, and that such action is exempt from CEQA pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8) and Section 15273 of the State CEQA Guidelines codified at 14 CCR §15273.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS,

- 1. The Board of Directors of the Marina Coast Water District does hereby approve and adopt the capital elements of the FY 2010-2011 Budget for water, recycled water and wastewater services to the Ord Community.
- 2. The capital elements of the compensation plan for the area of Ord Community within FORA's jurisdiction, including capacity charges, set forth on **Attachment A** to this Resolution are hereby approved and adopted. The District is authorized to charge and collect capacity charges for provision of water and wastewater services within the boundaries of the Fort Ord Reuse Authority in accordance with the schedule set forth in **Attachment A**. The District is further authorized to use the same charges in providing services to the area of Ord Community within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army.
- 3. The charges authorized by this Resolution shall not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing the services for which the charges are imposed.
- 4. The District will comply with the requirements of Government Code section 54999.3 before imposing a capital facilities fee (as defined in Government Code section 54999.1) on any school district, county office of education, community college district, the California State University, the University of California or state agency.

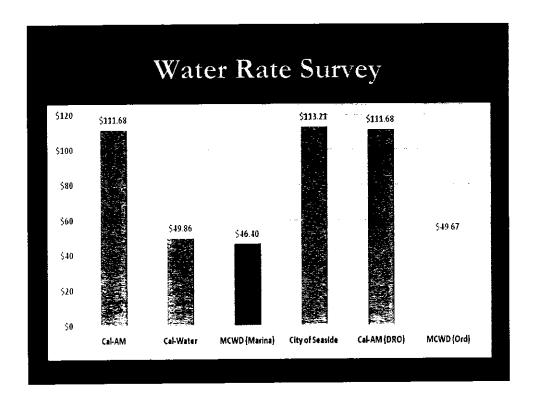

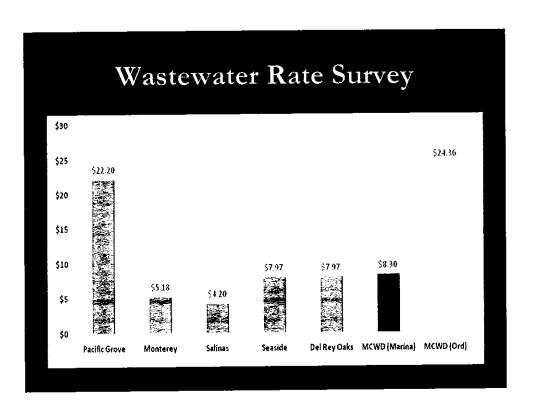
