Dear Members of the FORA Board of Directors and Executive Director Houlemard,

We represent the Monterey/Santa Cruz Counties Building & Construction Trades Council. This letter responds to FORA's request that the California Department of Industrial Relations ("DIR") determine whether or not FORA is subject to SB 854 requirements. The Building Trades Council commends FORA for exploring more effective means of ensuring compliance with the Master Resolution's prevailing wage requirement. The Building Trades Council and its affiliated unions have documented instances in which contractors have avoided their prevailing wage obligations. Attempts to secure certified payroll records ("CPRs") on Fort Ord projects have been met by delay and blurred lines of responsibility. Moreover, jurisdictions like the City of Marina have publicly stated that they lack the capacity to monitor projects in their jurisdictions for prevailing wage compliance. Clearly, there is a need for a new approach to monitoring and compliance. Only FORA can effectively monitor and police the Master Resolution's prevailing wage requirement, as Master Resolution Section 1.02 already requires it to do.

As you are aware, SB 854 made several changes to the laws governing how the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) monitors compliance with prevailing wage requirements on public works projects, including registration requirements for contractors and a requirement that contractors provide electronic certified payroll records to DIR for monitoring. DIR's monitoring and compliance efforts, however, attach only to "public works" projects, as defined in California Labor Code § 1720. Many development projects on Fort Ord will meet the definition of a public work under state law because they "paid for in whole or in part out of public funds." However, the prevailing wage requirements under the Master Resolution have a broader scope than "public works" under the Labor Code.

Master Resolution Section 3.03.090 applies to all "First Generation Construction performed on parcels subject to the Fort Ord Base Reuse Plan," regardless of whether the ultimate construction is paid for in whole or in part out of public funds. The Master Resolution's prevailing wage requirement devolves on member jurisdictions and developers through FORA's Implementation Agreements with member jurisdictions and the deeds transferring Fort Ord land. *Monterey/Santa Cruz Counties Building & Construction Trades Council v. Cypress Marina Heights L.P*, 191 Cal.App.4th 1500 (2011). FORA polices compliance with the prevailing wage requirement both through its consistency determinations and through its authority under Section 1.02.

The Master Resolution's prevailing wage requirement was thus intended to be broader than that under state law and to have a different enforcement mechanism. From the policy's adoption in 1995, FORA's Board recognized the particular importance of a prevailing wage mandate to Fort Ord's economic revitalization.

DIR will only have jurisdiction over those Fort Ord development projects (or portions of development projects) that are also "public works" under the Labor Code. Rather than relying on patchwork monitoring from DIR, FORA should establish its own compliance and monitoring program to ensure compliance with its own Master Resolution.

Members of the Board, after many meetings looking into your blank stares when we bring up 1.02 of the Master Resolution we believe it is time for Counsel (Mr. Giffen) to inform the Board and the public of his professional opinion of the meaning and intent of Article 1.02 (1.02.010

- 1.02.110). If he has already done so we request a copy of his opinion.

There seems to be no concern that violations of the MR are taking place and the active jurisdictions and FORA are not responding as per 1.02 even though a jurisdiction claims ignorance, lack of resources and not being responsible. We do applaud your current efforts to bring real compliance to future projects but note this does not alleviate the current problems. Since we are not attorneys we may be wrong in our opinion of 1.02 but it seems we are the only ones whoever mention it and when we do we get the feeling we just drove into the herd around the corner at nighttime. It is called "Enforcement of Master Resolution" and its content seems very simple to understand but again we are not attorneys. The MR is almost 20 years old. Elected officials, City Managers, County Administrators, and City and County staffs, have changed over time. Original intent is being lost in many areas of the MR and as per 1.02 it seems those responsible are in doubt as to their responsibility. In one conversation with the past Sheriff and Head Deputy when told of our opinion of their FORA role the Deputy said, "They can't tell us what to do. We didn't agree to that" and in another incident with a Police Chief it was reported he said, "I don't work for FORA". We have reported in past FORA meetings that the responsible officials in each jurisdiction need to be educated as to their responsibilities. We are beginning to believe now more than ever that the education effort may need to be extended to Admin and staff in the jurisdictions of FORA. Lastly, we are deeply concerned that the possible lack of attention by all responsible parties to what may be their responsibility may lead to legal action. It is very disappointing when the only way to receive justice is through unnecessary litigation caused by the actions or in this case the lack of action on the part of those who should have acted. Therefore I hereby request that FORA assign Mr.

Giffen the duty to write a brief of his professional opinion as to the meaning and intent of Article 1.02 in its entirety. We are in hope that this effort will eliminate the perceived void which exists in the understanding of 1.02 even if that void is solely our own. If so assigned we would like a copy when complete. On behalf of the Plumbers and Steamfitters United Association Local 62, we are writing this letter to you today, in regards to the Promontory student housing for California State University Monterey Bay. We are very concerned about the health and safety of approximately 600 young college students that will be living in this particular housing project.

According to the most recent edition of The California Plumbing Code; "ABS and PVC installations are limited to not more than two stories of areas of residential accommodation." This is continually cited in the code book e.g. Chapter 7 Sanitary Drainage 701.1, Chapter 9 Vents 903.1.1, and Chapter 11 storm Drainage 1101.3.1. This is also cited in the California Health and Safety Code Section 17922.

The entire four story Promontory student housing's waste, vent, and rain water leaders have been installed using ABS piping. This is a direct violation of the, California Health and Safety Code, and the California Plumbing Code, and is therefore a violation of California State Law. How this piping was allowed to be installed, and how it ever passed any inspections is mind boggling to us. The California Plumbing Code, the California Health and Safety Code, especially as it pertains to the safety of young college students is something that should be taken seriously. The public has a right to know of this potential fire safety hazard their children might be exposed to, and how this hazard has been increased, by this clear violation of the law. The potential for disaster here is very disturbing to us and we feel it should require your immediate attention.

Please let us know how you are planning to address this issue.

It has been one month since the tragic balcony collapse at a Berkeley Apt. complex where 6 students lost their lives and 7 were injured. What did we learn from this? That inattention to codes and improper building procedures can have devastating effects. What did CSUMB, Marina, and AMCAL G.C. learn? Nothing. In a July 15, 2015 letter Plumbers Local # 62 has revealed that ABS pipe has been used for waste, vent, and rainwater leaders in the 4 story buildings of The Promontory in Marina. This was done in spite of the fact that this is in violation of the Calif. Health & Safety Code and Calif. Plumbing Code which limits the use of ABS or PVC pipe in residential structures over two (2) stories. If there were a fire ABS is a known toxic and carcinogen and you don't want to breathe its fumes. Cast iron pipe is the standard. This is a liability no responsible official or entity should accept.

Plumbers Local #62 has known this for some time and has made every effort to inform responsible entities from the Builder, City, University staff, and State officials to no avail. Their letter may be a last ditch effort to right a disaster in the making before seeking a legal remedy. But, it seems those who have been informed are engaged in finger pointing and a great amount of CYA as silence is setting in.

Mayor Delgado's "Gem" has had other problems of which some are trying to be ignored. Lack of attention to weatherproofing during the rains received last Nov. & Dec. drenched the interiors of the buildings and fans were run for weeks to try and stem the growth of mold. Later it was discovered that @ 700 plumbing valves were left out, after the walls were closed, and they had to be installed. During installation over a weekend the water was left on and again the interior of one of the buildings was drenched. The CSUMB Science Dept. may be interested in the project because of its potential value as a mold incubator if proper remediation did not take place. Only time will tell as mold is very hardy, likes confined spaces, and is difficult to eliminate.

One other "glitch" in the works is the under payment of wages to construction workers. The Promontory is a project on the former Ft Ord which is required to pay State Prevailing Wages as implemented by FORA in its Master Resolution. These wages were supposed to be protected by monitoring via a compliance firm. Upon investigation it was learned the compliance company had an employee who was a friend of someone in the AMCAL group. It was stated, "We do all their work, we have an exclusive agreement". After much monitoring with no identified issues workers started coming forward and continue to come forward making claims of under payment. To date, claims exceed @ \$1 million and are rising. And these are only the ones who are brave enough to come forward. As workers are deprived of their just due responsible entities like Marina sit back and claim they don't have the staff and really aren't responsible for what apparently can be classified in the opinion of many and the workers affected as theft.

To the CSUMB potential renters – caveat emptor, "let the (in your case) renter beware". Please understand, that we as professionals abhor shoddy workmanship, cheats, and those who aim to profit regardless of who they may put in danger. Understand, we are parents and would not put our children's future in jeopardy to gain a promotion. Understand, that you are the future and we owe you the best.

FYI – ABS plastic pipe is composed of Acrylonitrile Butadiene Styrene. When burned it release over 27 compounds of which the two predominant ones are Carbon Monoxide and Hydrogen Cyanide. It is similar to most other plastics when burned.

On July 27, 2015, Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency (MRWPCA) Board of Directors approved the "Points of Tentative Agreement" with Marina Coast Water District (MCWD) regarding recycled water and recycled pipeline.

On August 3, 2015, MCWD Board of Directors also approved this agreement with the additional provision that

this agreement is subject to FORA's endorsement in accordance with previous signed agreement with FORA.

One of the agreed provision is that MRWPCA no longer provides recycled water for irrigation at the Ord Community. Instead, MRWPCA will provided advanced treated water for irrigation.

Prompt consideration and decision by FORA Board on the approval of this change from recycled water to advanced treated water for irrigation at the Ord Community will avoid delay of the Pure Water Monterey Project. If FORA Board considers this item at the August Board meeting, it will save at least one month delay.

Dear Michael:

In case you are not aware, MCWD Board of Directors has appointed President Gustafson and I as authorized negotiators to negotiate with MRWPCA on the recycled water and recycled pipeline. MCWD Board of Directors did not appoint any District staff as negotiator.

MRWPCA also has appointed Directors Downey and Stafani as their negotiators on the recycled water and recycled pipeline.

Keith Israel previously told me that he informed you of MRWPCA and MCWD negotiations last year and you supported our negotiations.

The four of us have met to negotiate these issues and we should continue to do so. It is not appropriate for us to meet with FORA since neither Board has approved such arrangement with FORA. Additionally, FORA has not been a party nor signed the five-party agreement including any confidentiality and non disclosure agreement.

Since no MCWD staff is appointed as negotiator, none is authorized to negotiate on behalf of the District. But Howard and I were authorized to direct MCWD staff to support the negotiation.

As far as MCWD is concerned, it is not useful nor productive for MCWD staff to engage in any discussion on the recycled water and recycled pipeline without our instructions and approval.

It seems OK to have staff at three agencies engaged in discussion of alternatives for the water augmentation provided MCWD staff receive our direction and approval before any such discussion to avoid wasting time.

In fact, these discussions should occur at the established FORA Water and Wastewater Oversight Committee since these issues affect other agencies. For example, the proposal by MRWPCA to replace the supply of recycled water with advanced treated water to the Ord Community affects CSUMB and Seaside since CSUMB and Seaside show recycled water usage in their new master plan and Monterey Downs project.

Additionally, MRWPCA has expressed that time is of the essence for their Pure Water Monterey project. It is not productive to have FORA now engaged in the formal negotiation at this late period. However, FORA staff or FORA WWOC still can provide suggestions or recommendations to MCWD and MRWPCA negotiators on the water augmentation plan.

The delay in considering and endorsing the replacement of recycled water with advanced treated water by FORA Board will definitely affect the Pure Water Monterey project.
