

Groundwater Sustainability Agency Joint Powers Authority

SIGMA

- 2014 Sustainable Groundwater Management Act
- Requires formation of sustainability agencies and development of sustainability plans for 127 priority groundwater basins, designated by state, including the Salinas Valley
- State Board Intervention if GSA not formed or any overlap not resolved by June 30, 2017 (extended to August 31)

Step one

Form

Step two

Develop Groundwater Sustainability Plan

January 31, 2020
For Basins designated high or

For Basins designated high or medium and critical overdraft

Step three

Achieve Sustainability

20 years after adoption of plan*

^{*}DWR may grant up to two, five-year extensions on implementation upon showing of good cause and progress


CASGEM Groundwater Basin Prioritization — South Central Region

Groundwater Sustainability Agencies

Management Responsibilities (Required by Law)

- Prepare and implement GW Sustainability Plan
- Maintain basin sustainability
- Conduct public hearing on plan
- Submit annual reports

Authorities (Discretionary Tools)

- Conduct studies
- Register + monitor wells
- Require extraction reporting
- Regulate extractions
- Implement projects
- Assess fees to cover costs
- Rules, regulations


Joint Powers Authority

About

- ✓ Authorizes joint exercise of powers of member agencies
- √ Can create new legal entity
 - Members are insulated from liability and debts
- ✓ JPA Members create Governing Board
- ✓ Board members can differ from JPA members
- ✓ Voting requirement to change agreement

Why Recommended?

- √ Timely formation—able to meet State deadline
- ✓ Liability protection
- ✓ Governing board based on consensus recommendation


